

## HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE JANUARY 7, 2026, CUC BOARD MEETING

The regular meeting of the Board of the Collamer United Church was called to order on January 7, 2026, at 6:05 p.m. in the Collamer United Church lounge.

**MINUTES:** A motion was properly made by Elder Emeline McShane and seconded by Elder Judith Parker to approve the regular Session minutes of December 7, 2025. Motion passed.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Elder Pamela Laroche presented the financial reports of the church for the month of November 2025. A motion was made by Elder Leslie DuMond and seconded by Elder Jeannine Parks to accept the Treasurer's Reports November 2025. Motion passed.

**PASTOR'S REPORT:** Rev. Adamcik noted he was on vacation December 25 through January 3.

Rev. Adamcik reported he will be doing another online program about preaching. This will meet on Thursday evenings in February. He is also planning to attend an Emerging Leaders Cohort that will gather March 22-25, 2026, in Lake Tahoe. This is presented by Auburn Union Seminary. There should be no expenses associated with this training.

**BUILDING AND GROUNDS:** It was noted that Elders Gill and Pam Laroche set up the outdoor nativity on December 4. It will be taken down soon.

The new water meter was installed on December 16.

The heat in the Narthex was not working properly. On December 23, 2025, Cooney Heating and Air Conditioning came and noted several issues. Temporary repairs to the system were made. The boiler system is old and in poor condition. Gill Laroche will investigate the possibility of replacing the boiler and the possible installation of air conditioning in the sanctuary.

Shawn and Jaden Ellis mopped the kitchen and fellowship hall floors. Ginnie Busco is continuing to do weekly cleaning. Dave Vollmer has plowed the parking lot as needed.

Efforts to discuss with Gerharz Equipment concerning possible replacement of the stove are continuing.

**CHRISTIAN EDUCATION:** Elder Jeannine Parks reported the Advent Bible study wrapped up on December 21. We used the devotional "The Uncluttered Heart: Making Room for God during Advent and

Christmas. We alternated between churches for the four sessions. It was well received.

**MEMBERSHIP AND EVANGELISM:** Elder Emeline McShane reported that cards/calls/visits are continuing. We are now placing cards on the podium in the Narthex each Sunday to be signed by the congregation and sent to various individuals.

**MISSIONS:** Elder Merle Oswald reported concerning the following mission projects:

**St. Matthews Food Pantry** - During December, we collected 106 cans of various meats for St. Matthew's Food Pantry, including tuna, Beefaroni, spaghetti with meatballs, Vienna sausage, spam, ham, chicken breast, chili, pasta rings with meat balls, corned beef and breakfast sausage hash, raviolis, and chili beans. They were dedicated by Elder Bill Porter on December 28, 2025. They were delivered by Wayne Brignall along with other donated items.

**Christmas Gifts** - We collected gifts for families of two children attending the East Syracuse-Minoa schools. Each child received five gifts and gift cards were provided for the parents/guardians. The gifts were picked up by the school counselor on December 16.

**Cookies** - We also packaged cookies for 10 people/groups including our homebound, the mail carrier and Al-Anon on December 14, Mission Sunday. Thanks to all who purchased and wrapped gifts and made and packed cookies!

**Hat & Mitten Tree** - The hat and mitten tree has been set up in the Narthex. We are collecting hats, gloves, mittens, and scarves to be provided to the Rescue Mission.

**TECHNOLOGY:** Elder Judith Parker reported the Facebook page and website continue to be updated on a regular basis. Joe Hudgins has joined the committee and will likely work on the website. Research was done on getting a website manager to improve the site.

**WORSHIP:** Elder Connie Oliver submitted a written report as follows:

  - Communion - 28 were served communion by intinction, including one in the pew; Karen Brignall and Connie Oliver were communion stewards.
- December 14 (Mission Sunday) - during the service, the gifts to our ESM families were dedicated.
- 4th Sunday of Advent wrapped up December 21, 2025. Joe Hudgins and Amy Caldeira are our newest volunteers. Thank you!
- Christmas Eve service 7 pm was well attended. FUCOES choir members joined CUC voices. Christy's 2 daughters sang. Many people stepped up to handle various tasks (acolyte, reader(s), Advent wreath, hand out candles, turn out lights before Silent Night candle lighting, etc.)
- Elder Bill Porter and Andrea Scerbo filled in at 9:30 service on December 28. Kara Zimmerman accompanied Andrea on her violin, which was well received. Canned meat items for East Syracuse food pantry were dedicated.

**OLD BUSINESS:** The Annual Congregational meeting will be held on Sunday, January 25, 2026. This is being announced from the pulpit every Sunday, starting on January 4. Committee reports are due no later than January 11.

Our first Holiday Craft Sale and Baked Ziti Lunch/Dinner took place on Saturday, December 6, in the Fellowship Hall. It was a very successful event.

Connie Oliver noted that she worked with the sign manufacturer in New Hampshire and our electronic sign is functioning properly again.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Arise-Exceptional Family Resources will be utilizing the Fellowship Hall for the Funtastic Friday's program during January and February.


