

Beautiful, and moving, and a unique way to experience the sacrament. Choir anthem lyrics are now being projected. We continued extinguishing another candle on the Lenten ring each Sunday. #### Adopt-A-Highway



#### HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE CUC BOARD MEETING February 28, 2024

This regular meeting of the Board of the Collamer United Church was called to order on February 28, 2024, at 6:05 p.m. via Zoom. Elder Connie Heidt-Oliver opened the meeting with prayer and Elder Jerome O'Neill served as moderator.

<u>ELECTIONS</u>: It was noted that it was necessary to elect a Moderator for 2024. A motion was made by Elder Leslie DuMond and seconded by Elder Connie Heidt-Oliver to elect Elder Jerome O'Neill to serve as Moderator. Motion passed.

It was noted that it was necessary to elect a Clerk of Session for 2024. A motion was made by Elder Connie Heidt-Oliver and seconded by Elder Judith Parker to elect Elder Leslie DuMond to serve as Clerk of Session. Motion passed.

<u>MINUTES:</u> A motion was properly made by Elder Judith Parker and seconded by Elder Connie Heidt-Oliver to approve the regular Session minutes of January 24, 2024.

A motion was properly made by Elder Judith Parker and seconded by Elder Merle Oswald to approve the minutes of the January 28, 2024, Annual Congregational Meeting. Motion passed.

A motion was properly made by Elder Emeline McShane and seconded by Elder Connie Heidt-Oliver to approve the minutes of February 18, 2024, Special Congregational Meeting. Motion passed.

<u>TREASURER'S REPORT:</u> A motion was properly made by Elder Leslie DuMond and seconded by Elder Judith Parker to accept the Treasurer's reports for January 2024.

<u>VITAL STATISTICS</u>: Benjamin RyLee Theodore Smith, Pat Pease's great grandson, was baptized on February 11, 2024. Rev. Swanson officiated. Cora Galster, a former member, passed away on February 23, 2024. Rev. Swanson will officiate at her funeral service.

<u>PASTOR'S REPORT</u>: Rev. Swanson reported the Lenten Bible Study has begun the first two sessions have taken place and have been well attended.

Rev. Swanson distributed and reviewed a list of things that need to be provided to the new pastor and things that should be done before and after his arrival. Discussion took place concerning the items to be provided and the possibility of putting together a photo directory of members and regular worship service attendees.

<u>BUILDING AND MAINTENANCE</u>: Elder Jerome O'Neill reported all inspections have taken place except the building inspection by the Town of Dewitt. He will work with Gill Laroche concerning scheduling that inspection.

<u>MEMBERSHIP AND EVANGELISM:</u> Elder Emeline McShane reported calls and cards to shut-ins are continuing. She will assist with preparation of a photo directory

<u>MISSIONS</u>: Elder Merle Oswald reported concerning the following mission projects:

<u>St. Matthews Food Pantry:</u> - In February, we collected 5 boxes of food and 33 egg cartons for St. Matthew's Food Pantry. They were delivered by Wayne Brignall.

January -Mission: During January and February, we collected cans of soup and boxes and bags of crackers to be donated to the St. Matthew's Food Pantry. We collected 38 boxes and bags of crackers and 144 cans of assorted soups. Wow! The soup and crackers were blessed by Rev. Swanson on "Soup"er Bowl Sunday, February 11, 2024. The soup and crackers were packed up by several helpers after the Ash Wednesday service and delivered to St. Matthew's Food Pantry by Merle Oswald on February 15.

<u>February - March Missions:</u> We are continuing to collect food coloring for St. Matthew's Food Pantry to provide to families in need for coloring Easter eggs. They will provide information on how to use it to color eggs. Our Mission Fund will also donate \$200 to St. Matthew's Food Pantry to help defray their cost of purchasing eggs. The collection will run through Sunday, March 17. An Easter basket has been placed in the Narthex.

One Great Hour of Sharing- For March, we will also be accepting donations for this worthy cause. Envelopes are located on the table in the rear of the Sanctuary. The deadline is Easter Sunday, March 31.

<u>Presbytery Grant</u> - We have been advised that we will be receiving a \$500 grant from the Presbytery to be used for meals for the needy.

<u>Adopt-A-Highway</u> – It was noted that Mike Breclaw will head up the Adopt-A-Highway project in April. Discussion

took place concerning an appropriate date for this project. April 7 was suggested.

<u>PASTOR / PARISH RELATIONS</u>: Elder Leslie DuMond reported a special congregational meeting was held after the worship service on Sunday, February 18, to vote on the recommendation of the Pastor Nominating Committee that Eric Adamcik become our new installed Pastor. Eric will begin his ministry with us and the First United Church of East Syracuse on April 1 and will be here for worship on April 7.

We are working with Eric to help him find appropriate housing. Due to limited availability, it may be necessary to secure an apartment for March to ensure Eric will have a place on April 1. Discussions between the PNC for both churches have taken place concerning the possibility of the churches pitching in toward rent/security deposit to help Eric get settled prior to his receiving any salary. It is expected that his moving expenses will be minimal so any contribution toward rental expenses would be somewhat offset by that.

<u>TECHNOLOGY:</u> Elder Judith Parker reported she will assist with training the new pastor on use of the phone system and other technology in the church. It was noted that the new pastor will need a computer. It was determined to reach out to him concerning this and the possibility of use of his professional expenses for this purchase.

WORSHIP: Elder Connie Heidt-Oliver reported that Rev. Swanson will be in our pulpit through Easter Sunday, March 31. On February 4, communion was served to 31 by intinction plus 1 individual package. We introduced a gluten-free communion option. On February 11 (Souperbowl Sunday), we had a blessing of the crackers and soup collected for St. Matthew's food pantry and the baptism of Pat Pease's great grandson, Benjamin RyLee Theodore Smith. On February 18, we introduced Eric Adamcik. A congregational meeting was held after the worship service, and we voted to call him to be our minister. On February 25, Rev. Swanson ordained Emeline McShane as an Elder and the new Board class was installed.

OLD BUSINESS: Elder Pamela Laroche reported that comments have been received on the proposed standard Employee Handbook provided at no cost by ADP. We believe the handbook is complete and ready to be finalized. A motion was made by Elder Leslie DuMond and seconded by Jerome O'Neill to approve the Employee Handbook, subject to some minor revisions.

Elders Leslie DuMond and Connie Oliver reported that discussions have been continuing concerning the 4-H Program's use of the fellowship hall and kitchen. As previously discussed, this would be a partnership where, in exchange for use of the fellowship hall and kitchen for various events and classes, 4-H leaders, children and families will provide

volunteer services to the church. Such services will include helping with fundraisers such as dinners and the rummage sale, clean-up of the church property, and participation in missions. The 4-H representatives have indicated that they would be happy to dispose of any garbage generated during events and pay a nominal fee of \$25 when the kitchen is used. They have provided a proposed contract between the parties. It was determined that trash removal should be referenced. A motion was made by Elder Jerome O'Neill and seconded by Elder Connie Heidt-Oliver to approve the contract with the 4-H program, subject to the modification discussed above.

Elder Leslie DuMond recommended that the rummage sale be held September 13 and 14 with a clearance sale the morning of September 21. A motion was made by Elder Connie Heidt-Oliver and seconded by Elder Merle Oswald to approve the rummage sale dates.

Elder Leslie DuMond reported the dinner committee is recommending the following dates for our Fall dinners: October 5 and November 2. A motion was made by Elder Leslie DuMond and seconded by Elder Jerome O'Neill to approve the dinner dates.

<u>NEW BUSINESS:</u> Elder Jerome O'Neill suggested that a deep cleaning of the kitchen take place. We will request volunteers and schedule a date for cleaning.

The next meeting of the CUC Board will be March 27, 2024 at 6:00 p.m.
