This regular meeting of the Board of the Collamer United Church was called to order on October 26, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. in the lounge. Elder Leslie DuMond opened the meeting with prayer and served as Moderator.

A motion was properly made by Elder Judith Parker and seconded by Elder Connie Heidt-Oliver to approve the regular Session minutes of September 28, 2022, as amended.

Elder Pamela Laroche reviewed the financial reports of the church. A motion was made by Elder Leslie DuMond and seconded by Elder Jerome O'Neill to accept the Treasurer's Report for September 2022.

BUILDING AND MAINTENANCE: Elder Jerome O'Neill reported the fire suppression inspection was completed on September 29, 2022. We passed inspection. He changed the light bulbs in the Fellowship Hall. Elder Susan O'Neill reported a birthday cake and reception will be held after the worship service on December 4 to celebrate Dick Way's 90th birthday.


